Impact of Domestic Abuse

Experiencing domestic abuse (DA) affects everyone differently. It may impact a child or young person's (CYP) emotional and psychological wellbeing and could cause behavioural changes that may affect their relationships and their performance at school. It may also impact their sense of safety and cause a lack of trust¹.


Legislative changes implemented in the Domestic Abuse Act (2021) mean that CYP are now legally recognised as victims if they see, hear or otherwise experience the effects of domestic abuse and are related to either the abuser or the abused^{2.}

Between December 2020 and October 2021, just over half of high-risk domestic abuse cases within Cumbria had CYP within the household, with approximately 150 CYP affected ⁴. If medium risk cases were included, this number could be considerably higher.

Our CYP Domestic Abuse Service

In November 2021, Cumbria's Police & Crime Commissioner launched a new Victim Support (VS) service offering skills and enablement support to CYP impacted by DA within the county. The service will provide support on a one-to-one or group basis depending on needs assessment and risk.

When a VS DA practitioner works with CYP we will use the My StarTM approach⁴. Using the star allows us to consider those aspects of life that CYP feel are important to them, as shown in the diagram below:



The My Star[™] approach identifies manageable steps so that support can be tailored to each individual CYP journey and provides effective outcome measurement. Utcomes





Our group-work will be facilitated using the Rockpool CYP Domestic Abuse Recovery Toolkit © ⁵

This 8 week programme, co-facilitated by two CYP DA practitioners, is designed to inspire hope, promote resilience and support recovery with sessions focussed on skills enablement in development areas as follows:

Recovery - building healthy relationships Empowerment - developing confidence & resilience.

Connectedness - with family, friends & community to overcome isolation. Objectivity - Learning coping strategies & improving emotion regulation. Vigilance - become aware of harmful patterns in self and others. Empathy - being kind to self and others **R**espect - respecting self and others, facing what has happened with courage. You - supported to focus on their own recovery to allow their true self to emerge and live a life free from trauma.
